Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Faith,

Happy New Year! Advent comes again-providing us with a brand new opportunity to be released from the captivity of meaningless activity and unending drains upon our time and attention for things that have no eternal significance—and reorient

our lives once again to the worship and praise of the most high God! Preparing for the birth of Jesus, we also seek to identify the very presence of Christ in our midst. We celebrate the hope that is ours as followers of Jesus and we seek to distribute that hope in the world through our words and actions. Advent is a deconstructing time...a re-constructing time...a blessing and gift that is ours for the celebrating!

To assist you in the celebration of this Advent gift, we offer "The Advent Project", a list of daily readings from the Bible for December 1st-25th. Begin your day listening and praying over God's Word, and discover how the themes and the direction of these simple verses can infuse your day with holy thought and action! If you prefer to take on an entire book of the bible for Advent consideration, Matthew's Gospel is our focus for the coming year. Read a Chapter of Matthew each day, or simply start reading Matthew, chewing over each word and phrase, and move at a pace that the Spirit leads. As the Word of God is "made flesh" in Jesus' Birth, may we receive and bear that Word in the world!

One of the added joys of this Advent Season is the continued work of our Growing Young Task Force. We have established some significant goals for the next six to nine months, and we celebrate our two major outreach efforts to our community this year: the Ice Cream Social and Trunk or Treat. We are learning that our neighbors come and join in fun and fellowship when we invite them. We are learning about the diverse needs that exist in our community. We are gearing up to strengthen the offerings that we have for our young people already — and the new ventures that we are called to develop.

The areas of our goals are building intergenerational relationships, creating more warmth and welcome in our physical space, and investing in a full time youth and family pastor to support us in our goals of helping children and young adults fall in love with Jesus and find a place of service and growth in our faith community. Because the number of seminary students available to spend a year on internship has dwindled to a handful it is very uncertain again that

we can have an intern in the coming year. That reality, coupled with our desire to have continuity in staff for our young people, is leading our leadership to begin exploring options for calling a pastor dedicated to youth and family ministry. As much as I have enjoyed our role in raising up new pastors over the years, it seems that it may be time to focus our attention and resources now on raising up vibrantly faithful young people in our faith community. God is moving in our midst and drawing us to be transformed, again and again....making all things new!

Speaking of things becoming new-or renewed—we are moving back inside for our early Sunday morning worship. For over two years, with the exception of a three month retreat inside during the summer months of 2022, we braved the rain and snow (ok, it just felt cold enough some days) and wind and heat...providing a safe place for people to worship on the lawn or in cars. Our hard-working worship set up and tear down team was so faithful and delighted to serve, for the first year and a half, anyway! Though they never once complained, one did confide in me that the prospect of getting up on Sunday morning to come help set things up outside moved from a joyous "I get to do this" in the beginning to a determined "I have to do this" toward the end. I am forever grateful that we are blessed with these willing servants: Larry and Rita Helberg, Ana and Gonzalo Hernandez, Arline Norton, Colin Nobles, Alecia and Jaden Jimenez, and Art and Kim Crawford. Thank you one and all!

Along with moving inside, we are moving our worship time up 15 minutes so there is time between services for musicians to warm up. Looking forward to seeing all y'all IN church!

Vicar's Voice

Dear friends,

It's the season of Advent! Let's talk about the three wise men "from the east" who brought gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh to the baby Jesus, according to Matthew's gospel.

In nativity scenes they're usually kneeling reverently in the straw before the newborn child in the manger while donkeys and oxen – or maybe a camel – look over their shoulders. Though familiar, this picture doesn't match Matthew's text. First, Matthew implies the visit occurred sometime after Jesus' birth, not on the same night. While meeting with Herod in Jerusalem, the men inquired about a baby who apparently had already been born, yet at that point

Today we honor the arrival of the wise men on January 6 (Epiphany) – the 12th day after Christmas. In some parts of the world, kids celebrate by leaving a bowl of water and some grass for the camels when they go to bed, hoping to find gifts in their shoes the next morning!

they didn't know where. It probably took time to locate him.

Another problem with the Nativity scenes: Matthew says the wise men found Jesus and Mary in a house, not a stable, and there's no mention of a manger as in Luke's account. We may not even have the number of wise men right. Matthew doesn't say how many showed up. Some eastern traditions say twelve, but western churches settled on three, probably because of the three gifts.

We don't know exactly who they were, but eventually traditions arose to give the men names. The most common ones are Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar.

In 1857, an Episcopalian cleric composed "We Three Kings of Orient Are." The idea that the men were kings may have come from texts suggesting that kings would worship the Messiah (e.g., "May all kings fall down before him"; Psalm 72:11). But Matthew says they were "magi," not kings. Magi were priests in the Zoroastrian religion who studied astrology (including what we would call astronomy) and were known for their wisdom and learning.

"The Adoration of the Magi" has been a popular subject for artists throughout history. I especially like this painting

(Albrecht Dürer, 1471-1528) because of the way Melchior tilts his head as he speaks sweetly to the baby.

Rebecca's Notes

Dear Friends,

I'm looking forward to my son bringing his family to Christmas Eve service here at Trinity. I always hope they will enjoy the service and find it as meaningful as I do - but then I think about

how I've done Christmas like a million times and the kids have not. For kids, this is still new and as far as the music—Christmas Eve is only here once a year so do we really think they remember the hymns from last year? Sure, there is Christmas music playing even in Home Depot already but mostly it's the commercialized music and not the hymns we sing together in liturgical churches on Christmas Eve.

To prepare your kids, grandkids, Sunday School kids or other young people you know to more fully enjoy the Christmas Eve service I strongly suggest you help them learn the first verse (or more, depending on age) of all the hymns we will sing. If your reaction to this suggestion is "I wouldn't even know how to start!", I have a simple solution for you: LET YOUTUBE HELP YOU! (shocking, I know). But trust me, this will connect you with these young folks instantly because you're using a familiar platform and music style to help them appreciate something that might otherwise seem like someone else's music.

Here are the basic guidelines:

- 1. Kids LOVE hand motions. Hand motions help them remember all the complicated words and phrases in Christmas carols and gives them a way to use extra energy by moving their bodies. Also, some kids don't like to sing but they can still do the hand motions and everyone is happy!
- 2. Always use a contemporary version first. If you have time, maybe pull up a more traditional version laterlike something with the organ...but if you lead with this, chances are you'll lose their attention more quickly. Don't think of it as "giving in" to pop culture: think of it as using pop culture as a bridge to connect this young person to the traditional church.
- 3. In my classroom I have used many videos from "The Promise of Christmas" (Worship Together Kids) and "Songs of the Christmas Story" (Group Publishing). These publishers use young people as leaders in the videos and add a contemporary beat to the traditional music and words. In my classroom, we watch and sing together the first few times and when I think they've got it we sing just with piano or guitar and hand motions. Works like a charm! And they love it!

This year on Christmas Eve the choir, bell choir and Sunday praise band will offer music at the 4:00 and 5:30 services. Sergei will lead our 7:30pm worship.

We hope to see you at Trinity!



Chef Darrell's Korean Barbeque Sauce (Yummy!)

Recipe requested by popular demand after meal fundraiser!

- 1 cup soy sauce
- 3/4 cup dark brown sugar
- 2 TBL spoon minced garlic 1 TBL spoon rice wine vinegar
- 1 TBL spoon chile-garlic sauce or Sriracha
- 1 ½ T spoon ground black pepper
- 1 T spoon Asian toasted sesame oil
- (1TBL spoon cornstarch 1TBL spoon cold water) Blend until smooth
- 1. Sauté garlic for 45 seconds or until lightly
- 2. Brown and add all ingredients and bring to a slow boil
- Thicken with cornstarch mixture, stirring for 2-3 minutes on medium heat
- Remove from stove and let stand until cool or serve warm




















During Advent, we collect Diapers and funds to purchase diapers for families in our community who are in need of this basic necessity.

From TLC Health Ministry Team: Inflammation & Your Health

As Christ loved us, this is the season where we especially share love, gifts and caring. How will you share the love of Christ – what gifts are you giving to that goal? As a healthcare worker, I suggest that you take good care of yourself so that you are able to help others physically, emotionally, and spiritually.

Harvard medical school has published a report that you may wish to access called "fighting inflammation". The *Wall Street Journal* has also published information regarding inflammation and medical conditions. That study proposes that inflammation is the silent killer that impacts cardiovascular disease, cancer, diabetes 2 among other conditions. Three out of 5 deaths are linked to inflammation, according to the Information about this article.

Following are tried and true "rules of the road" to help you toward a healthy path:

- 1. The "right" amount of aerobic exercise-but beware that too much can cause inflammation. So, both ends of the spectrum can cause problems. As with most things in life, moderation is the key.
- 2. Weight control is important; also decrease belly fat and sugar in your diet.
- 3. Get enough sleep.
- 4. Stop or don't smoke.
- 5. Limit alcohol intake.
- 6. Control chronic stress (this may be the hardest of all to control).

As with anything worthwhile, there are no easy and complete answers. These are guides. Take steps to become healthier so you can worship the Lord with a healthy body and mind and so you might be of service to others.

Blessed Christmas season to all. May God richly Bless you with good health so you may you serve others and express God's Amazing Love.
