Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Faith,

So if you are hanging out with us in "THE TORAH" this Lent, you have already traversed half of Genesis! Whether you are reading the printed version or listening to the audio version, I suspect you are

hearing stories that you have heard before—as well as being surprised by a detail or two that seems new or just different from your memory. Most often I am listening as I ride my bike, making my morning exercise time more interesting

AND linking two important daily practices!

I read somewhere that if you link activities together, and make them part of your daily routine, you are more likely to be faithful and automatic in maintaining the habits you want to cultivate. I am already imagining that this routine could extend well beyond Easter. Immerse: Beginnings is the first of six such collections of scripture that will take us through the entire Bible in as many 40 day sessions. If you, too are thinking that you might want to extend the Lenten Challenge past Easter and keep going, shoot me an email or let me know when you see me in church.

As Lent unfolds, I am excited about the opportunities that are before us! Finally, we get to be back to the practice of Lenten Soup and Salad lunches and dinners! We will have both a vegetarian and a "soup of choice" option — plus a big

garden salad each week.

Principal Greg Sander will join us at the noon service on March 1st, to share about Prine Elementary. He will share the joys and challenges of our neighborhood elementary school, and how we can be involved. We are working on a pilot program with Principal Sander to connect with children who need one-on-one language assistance. Such a great opportunity to incarnate God's love for one of God's most vulnerable little ones!

We fell into a great opportunity to connect with the University of Sioux Falls Choir (62 voices) who will be in town on Wednesday, March 8th. They will come to Trinity for supper that night and then help lead and bless our worship with their gifts of song. If you can only get to one evening Lenten service, make sure it is that one!



Vicar's Voice

Dear friends,

During the season of Lent we prepare for Easter, which means you need to start figuring out what kind of Easter candy you plan to buy (or swipe from the kids you know). Don't worry, though. I'm here to help you with a well-researched list of recommendations.

Marshmallow Peeps look like little yellow chicks. This is the traditional version, at least. You can also find other animals, like bunnies, and they come in various colors and flavors. As the name suggests, they're made of marshmallows, and they're covered with sugar, which makes them super sweet, but not in a good way. Plus, they can dry out and get stale over time. Some people prefer them that way, but these same folks probably enjoy eating Styrofoam.

Cadbury Eggs have a hard chocolate shell with a white and yellow "yolk" inside made of sugar, syrup, cocoa butter, and some other stuff. It tastes ok if you can stand the thought of eating a runny raw egg. Personally, I don't think these are as good as they're cracked up to be.

Chocolate bunnies – now we're talking. You can't go wrong with a name-brand like Hershey's or Godiva for milk or dark chocolate that won't taste like plastic. Consider going with hollow rather than solid bunnies so you won't break a tooth.

Reese's Peanut Butter Eggs are a perfectly balanced blend of peanut butter and chocolate. Plus, unlike Reese's Cups, they come in frustration-free packaging that won't get chocolate under your fingernails, making you look as if you've just been gardening. Eggs-stra delicious.

Chicks, eggs, and bunnies are traditional symbols of new life, and that's why we see them everywhere at Easter. We remember Jesus' resurrection and also the promise of eternal life we've received from God. As we read in the letter to the Romans (6:5-6), "For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, so we might no longer be enslaved to sin."

Rebecca's Notes

Dear Friends,

One of the ways worship changes during Lent is we refrain from singing any "Alleluia". This tradition is thought to have begun in the middle ages when Bishop William Duranti wrote: "We part from

the Alleluia as from a beloved friend, whom we embrace many times and kiss on the mouth, head and hand, before we leave him." This tradition has carried on through the years and we may now think of it as giving up something we love temporarily,

so we can rediscover it with even more joy (on Easter). Often you'll hear this referred to as "burying the Alleluia".



Sometimes we don't notice what's missing until it comes back. Did you notice the lack of "alleluia" in our services? Maybe you knew about this tradition but haven't thought much about it lately. Take a moment to consider what fresh meaning "alleluia" will have to you when we join in singing it again on Easter ... after the passion of Palm Sunday, the remembrance of the last supper on Maundy Thursday, and the revisiting of the crucifixion on Good Friday. By Easter, the joy of "alleluia" will likely seem new again. And this is the point!

By the way, the Sunday praise band and choir will continue rehearsing throughout the season and for a few weeks after Easter, so there is still time to join up and raise your voice with us in praise. Email me!





The ABC's of Heart Health may include an AED

Although February is HEART month, we know heart health deserves year-round attention.



In January, football fans saw or heard of 24-year-old Buffalo Bills' Damar Hamlin's cardiac arrest on the field after an aggressive tackle that caused his heart to stop. Trained personnel on the field restarted his heart. He also arrested or had an irregular rhythm on the way to the hospital. Thanks to excellent medical teams, both on the field and in the hospital. Damar is alive to have the

chance to do what God is directing as his true purpose in life.

Where I'm going is - being in great physical condition doesn't guarantee prevention of such an event. The true heroes in my mind are the medical teams that administered the proper care. God's work. Their hands.

We have an AED (automatic external defibrillator) in the church narthex, on the wall to the right of the Vicar photos. If you are unfamiliar with this life-saving device, why not familiarize yourself with it, even going so far as to take a class in how to do it? Classes are available through both the Heart Association or the American Red Cross. If there is enough interest, we may be able to put together a training class at the church. Please let me or the church office know. Again - God's work. Our hands.
