For the great "cloud of witnesses" that surrounded us throughout pandemic and hurricane is the same cloud of witnesses that we will celebrate and rejoice over and share stories about and find renewed strength for following Jesus. And I can't wait to be together again!

Vicar's Voice

Greetings Trinity family!

In 2010, researchers Brandon Whittington and Steven Scher published an article on the relationship between different kinds of prayer and psychological well-being. They studied 430 people, including Protestants and Catholics, Buddhists, Jews, Hindus, Muslims, and

individuals who didn't identify with any religion. These participants completed several questionnaires that measured their psychological health and asked about their prayer activities.

The researchers realized there are different types of prayer. One type is *thanksgiving* – "expressions of gratitude towards God, made in reference to specific positive life experiences" (p. 60). For example, someone might thank God that yesterday she enjoyed a delicious meal with family and friends.

A second type of prayer is *supplication* – asking God to intervene in specific ways to help the person who is praying or someone else. For example, someone might ask God to assist him in finding a higher-paying job.

I'll focus on just two interesting results. First, the frequency of prayers of thanksgiving was positively correlated with life satisfaction and optimism. That's a fancy way of saying that participants who more often thanked God in prayer felt more satisfied with their lives and were more optimistic compared to participants who thanked God less often. In contrast, the more the participants engaged in prayers of supplication, the *less* satisfied they were with their lives. (Prayers of supplication weren't related to optimism one way or the other.)

These findings suggest that thanking God for your blessings can improve your well-being. That may be correct! Because the study was correlational, though, we can't rule out the possibility that participants who were more optimistic and more satisfied with life in the first place were more likely to thank God in prayer. Still, you can do your own experiment: Try increasing your prayers of thanksgiving and see if that changes the way you feel!

Mission Endowed Fund Receives Special Gift

From TLC Health Ministry Team: Stress, Health, and Faith

Life and stress go hand in hand. We've experienced lots of stressors in the last nearly three years — from COVID to Hurricane Ian, and everything in between. How we effectively manage and cope with the stress in our lives determines the degree to which we are healthy. Unhealthy behaviors (too much or wrong foods, alcohol or drugs, smoking, overworking, not sleeping) to cope with the stress will bring physical and emotional health issues.

Faith can be the invaluable anchor that keeps a person steady in times of stress. If followed, biblical principles can be the cornerstone our lives, enabling us to live a life less impacted by what otherwise would be stressful circumstances. The ability to manage the stress in our lives largely determines our health status.

Spiritual Exercises to help with stress:

- 1. Prayer
- 2. Attend worship services
- 3. Trust God and Depend on God believe that God is in control and that God will provide for our needs. Throughout God's Word, God encourages us to surrender on a deeper level, to be humble, and to depend on God.
- 5. Live by the Power of the Holy Spirit ask God to live through us. God's Spirit in us is the same Spirit that raised Jesus from the grave. The apostle Paul encourages us to live by God's Spirit.
- 6. Abide in Jesus Jesus tells us in John 15 to remain in him because apart from him we can do nothing. Apart from Jesus, we are not going to be able to manage all that life throws at us, including the stress in our life.

God gives us instructions for living because God knows that if we live by them, we'll be better able to manage the stress in our life. God wants our faith to be a resource to manage our stress in a healthy way. Matthew 11:28-30: Then Jesus said, "Come to me, all of you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me: for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."


