Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Faith,

Wow! What a thrilling day Friday, September 16th was! We brought a couple hundred of our "neighbors" to the first "Growing Young Experiment" - our Ice Cream Social!

1,000 postcard invitations were sent, Facebook ads targeted neighborhood residents and signage plus fliers all came together to create a way-better-than-anticipated influx of participants!

I have never been so proud of our Trinity peeps. Watching you welcome and talk to folks you have never met before, and play games and color and read Bible stories with little ones, just melted my heart. The ice cream we shared was pretty tasty too!

As we continue in our "Growing Young" journey, working with our Task Force and Andy Jung as consultant, I cannot wait to see what possibilities will pop up next for us to be adventuresome and courageous in our sharing God's welcome. As you will recall, the focus of our process is to deepen our effectiveness in helping young people discover the love of God and fall in love with our faith community.

Having been enamored of this faith community for many, many years, it is sometimes challenging to me to re-invent the way I engage in ministry. Growing Young is helping me again re-evaluate my perspectives on faith formation for our young people. We have worked toward crossgenerational learning experiences — drawing people of all ages together to share the process. Now we will keep regular cross-generational opportunities, and add age-related options as well.

Discovering leadership roles for our young people that they can excel in — like Tanner with the worship streaming and Rylie in singing with the Praise Band — continue to be in the forefront of our exploration. I look forward to having a revised Student Minister position in the near future, as we value our young people in their roles as worship leaders.

Check out the "Tree of Youth" in the Narthex, created by Rylie Bradley. While we have many more pictures to add, you can select the name of one of our young people to pray for daily, whether they are pictured or yet to be pictured. We also have our Tree of Life children pictured for you to select one of them (and their teacher) for prayers. Use your cell phone to snap the picture of your student, write your name down as prayer partner and that's all there is to it! You can be the advocate for one of these young people God has entrusted to our care, as you make a vital spiritual enhancement to another's faith. Thank you in advance for participating in this part of our Growing Young journey. It is only with your commitment and engagement that we will become more and more the agency for our young people's growth in God's love!

Don't forget to watch the bulletin for opportunities to gather in our Cross-Generation settings, where you can share life and faith "face-to-face" with others. Everyone is welcome and needed!

#### Vicar's Voice

Greetings TLC family!

As we approach Reformation Day, I'm reminded of a good-natured prank played by two Lutheran students at the university where I used to work. We were all in a group of volunteers that served "grab and go" breakfast items early in the morning to the campus com-

munity. On October 31, the young men snuck over to the Catholic church adjacent to our food station and taped a copy of Luther's 95 theses to the front door. They came back laughing and congratulating themselves for finishing the job before anyone arrived for morning mass. At least they used duct tape instead of creating holes in the door with nails.

Lutherans have always known how to be snarky, I guess. Did you know there's a website called the Lutheran Insulter (<a href="https://ergofabulous.org/luther/">https://ergofabulous.org/luther/</a>) that randomly generates examples of verbal abuse Martin Luther directed at his theological opponents in his writings?

"You are a toad eater and a fawner."

"You are such a coward that you try to catch every word and evaluate it like a man who tries to trap the wind in his coat."

"May God punish you, I say, you shameless, bare-faced liar, devil's mouthpiece, who dares to spit out, before God, before all the angels, before the dear sun, before all the world, your devil's filth." So poetic!

Luther was upset when Pope Leo X authorized the sale of indulgences to raise funds to construct St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. The medieval church taught that people's sins could be wiped away if they "made satisfaction," often by saying prayers or giving alms. However, if they didn't do enough before dying, their souls were trapped in purgatory until purified of every sin – a scary prospect! Indulgences reduced a soul's stint in purgatory, but in 1517 the church started selling them. Now the rich could (supposedly) afford to get their loved ones to heaven faster while the poor were forced to imagine their kin languishing in torment.

Economic injustice is a problem we still face today... some folks live comfortably while others struggle to pay for housing, healthcare, and other basics. Luther urged Christians to resist inequality by faithfully helping each other. "God does not need our good works," he wrote, "but our neighbor does."

Peace to you and happy "Reformation Month"!

#### Rebecca's Notes

Dear Friends.

At first, Queen Elizabeth II's funeral at Westminster Abbey on September 19 was not on my radar, but I happened to be driving Daniel to

the airport early that morning, and NPR was starting their live coverage of the event. I soon became obsessed with it. I looked up the order of service, researched the music leaders and perused the list of music that would be offered by the choir, organ, trumpets and bagpipes.

Though we are physically many miles away from the English people, we are still spiritually connected to the folks who both led and attended the service. We worship the same God and observe many of the same liturgical practices as those who worship at Westminster Abbey. We are connected in this way by a far more sacred thread than that of race, denomination, culture, economic demographic or any other thread we use to differentiate ourselves from other humans around the globe. Though one of the dividing lines in our church's history has been the defining of music as either "traditional" or "contemporary", the traditions of our worship practices connect us spiritually with other believers both along the timeline of human existence and along the physical miles that separate us around the Congregational song, community prayer, Holy Communion, sharing the peace, and hearing God's word read aloud are examples of traditions that strengthen our common identity as people of God.

### From TLC Health Ministry Team: Exercise to help your bones

Aerobic, weight bearing exercises help improve bone density and strength. Some weight bearing exercises are:

- walking with or without weights, and
- resistance exercises.

These activities help increase muscle strength and work to improve balance. Strengthening muscles helps decrease the chances of falling.

Daily exercises to help improve strength and balance:

- Weight bearing aerobic exercises like taking stairs and walking with weights are good. (Swimming, aerobics, elliptical trainers, and biking do little to improve your bone density and strength – however, they can be helpful as low impact exercises.) The really important factor to build bone mass is weight bearing exercises.
- Strength or resistance training with weights, exercise bands, using your body weight help to increase muscle strength especially by the spine plus these exercises help to protect bones and work to increase bone mass.
- Flexibility, stability, and balance exercises that may help prevent falling include: Yoga (now available free at Trinity), Pilates, Tai Chi, stretching, simple exercise of standing on one leg.

When starting a new exercise routine:

- Check with your doctor.
- Listen to your body if you hurt for 2 days after exercises that can be normal; BUT if the pain is sharp or severe, check with your doctor immediately.
